 - Slough—Devitalized, must be debrided
 - Eschar—Devitalized
 - Dry Gangrene—Necrosis/Tissue Demise

Wound Margin Issues and Strategies

- Epiboly—Rolled Edges
- Hyperkeratotic—Dry, Calloused Edges
- Jagged
- Epithelialization

- Peri-Wound Issues
 - Macerated
 - Desiccated
 - Erythema
 - Indurated
 - Atrophic/Fibrotic
 - Fluctuant

 - Oil emulsions
 - Ringer's Lactate impregnated
 - Combinations

- Moderate/Heavy/Copious drainage
 - Alginates/Hydrofibers
 - Topical Medications

- Critically Colonized/Infected Wounds
 - Silver Dressings
 - Silver Alginates/Hydrofibers, Hydrogels and Collagens
 - Antimicrobial impregnated dressings
 - Enzymatic debriders
 - Cleansing agents and other topicals

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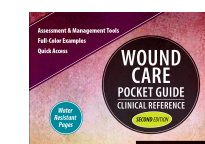

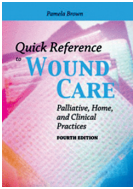

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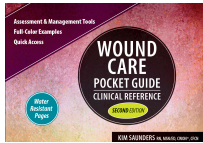
